Echoes of the Truth: A Chronology of the Tragic Events of 1979 (part 1)

More than 40 years have passed since that horrific year. At the time, the investigation into events surrounding the murder of Susan Reinert and her missing children took many twists and turns, often proceeding from speculation, which has left many of us with garbled memories of the facts. The King of Prussia Historical Society believes that it is important to document a chronology of the known facts to the best of our ability, while avoiding the sensationalism which some media outlets unfortunately gave in to at the time. We also believe that speculation where it occurs should be clearly labeled as such.
